Acts 27:9-44

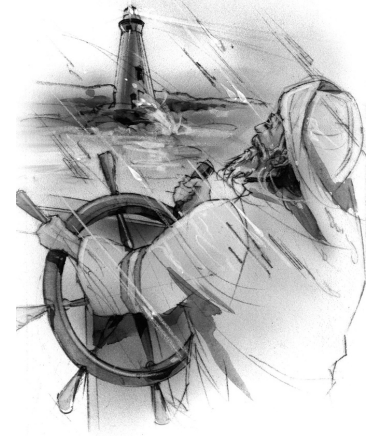
*“Men, I can see that our voyage is going to be disastrous

and to our own lives also.”*

*“Men, you should have taken my advice not to set sail to Crete;
then you would have spared yourselves this damage and loss.*

*But now I urge you to keep your courage,
because not one of you will be lost;
only the ship will be destroyed.”*

*“Just before dawn Paul urged them to eat.

you haven’t eaten anything. Now, I urge you to take some food. You need it to survive.*

Not one of you will lose a single hair from his head.’

After he said this, he took some bread and gave thanks to God in front of them all.

Then he broke it and began to eat.

They were all encouraged and ate some food themselves.”
