January Sermon Series: *Who is this Jesus?*

Today's Music

Worship starts with the second of three fantasies for handbells composed by Arnold Sherman. These pieces have become fixtures of the handbell repertoire, each composed four years apart: *Fantasy No. 1 in F Minor* was released in 1994, and the third fantasy (in G Minor) was published in 2002. Sherman's exciting *Fantasy No. 2 in C Minor*, which the Revelation Ringers play for us today, is perhaps the best-known of the three.

Rhythmic energy, tonal shifts and what the composer considers "sound melody" (whereby the "melody" isn't something tuneful and linear so much as one of harmonic progressions) makes this a riveting selection to begin worship.

Our 8:30 service is treated to an anthem from our youngest musicians, the singers of the Cherub Choir. A spiritual whose exact era and place of origin are unknown, *I've Got Peace Like a River* uses water imagery to describe the peace, love and joy of Christ. The first stanza's text may have been inspired by Isaiah 66:12: *For thus says the Lord: I will extend prosperity to [Jerusalem] like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing stream; and you shall nurse and be carried on her arm, and dandled on her knees.*

The Chancel Choir's selection this morning is in keeping with our theme for worship: we are called by Jesus to make disciples! A favorite selection from the prolific duo of Nancy Price and Don Besig, this piece opens and closes with asymmetrical meters and syncopated rhythms. It features a more reflective middle section with straighter rhythms and a "halftime" kind of feel.
